# U.S.-Mexico Trade: 2009 Figures Finish Below those in 2008

2001 was the last year trade between the U.S. and Mexico registered negatives in both of its trade components—U.S. exports to Mexico (-9.1 percent) and U.S. imports from Mexico (-3.3 percent). This resulted in an overall 5.9 percent drop in trade.

In 2009 with the recession well in swing, trade between the partners did not fare well and ended with negatives in both components. Unlike 2001, the drop in 2009 was higher with a drop in totat trade dollar value of 16.8 percent—U.S. exports (-14.9 percent) and U.S. imports (18.2 percent).

2008's figure was the highest all-time ever recorded for total trade dollar value (\$367.4 billion) between the trading partners, but at the end of 2009, the total trade dollar value registered \$305.4 billion or \$62.0 billion less.(See Table 1).

Like the trade values, the U.S. trade deficit with Mexico mainly shrunk due to the drop in trade—\$47.5 billion in 2009 compared

to \$64.4 billion in 2008.

The handling of merchandise in U.S.-Mexico trade is done primarily vía border ports of entry (\$243.6 billion or 80.0 percent of the trade dollar value in 2009). Tables 2 through 6 delineate the activity at the border and the 28 ports of entry (Harlingen International Airport was added in 2009) on the U.S.-Mexico border in terms of the dollar value of U.S. exports to Mexico, and U.S. imports from Mexico passing through them respectively. The top ten ports of entry processing this merchandise on the U.S.-Mexico border (ranked by total trade dollar value) were:

1) Laredo, TX; 2) El Paso, TX; 3) Otay Mesa Station, CA; 4) Hidalgo-Pharr, TX; 5) Nogales, AZ; 6) Eagle Pass, TX; 7) Brownsville, TX; 8) Calexico-East, CA; 9) Del Rio, TX; and 10) Santa Teresa, NM. —B. Garcia

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
#### Note from the Director

Indicators of border business activity that were reported for December 2009 end-of-year (EOY) demonstrated five indicators increased and sixteen decreased. 2009 EOY comparisons to 2008 reported for the border are listed below:

- Pedestrian bridge crossings into Mexico were down 2.2 percent.
- Pedestrian bridge crossings into Texas were down 28.7 percent.
- Vehicle bridge crossings into Mexico fell 13.7 percent.
- Vehicle bridge crossings into Texas fell 19.4 percent.
- Truck bridge crossings into Mexico lost 12.4 percent.
- Truck bridge crossings into Texas lost 13.6 percent.
- Rail car bridge crossings into Mexico went down 20.2 percent.
- Rail car bridge crossings into Texas went down 29.8 percent.
- Revenues data collected by U.S. Customs was not available at press time.
- Revenues collected by U.S. bridge operators registered a loss of 11.2 percent.
- Tourist visas issued for entry into Mexico were up 0.5 percent.
- Total employment was up 0.7 percent, with 3,270 jobs gained. The average unemployment rate for the border in December 2009 was 8.7 percent.
- Total building permits issued rose 6.2 percent.
- Total building permit values decreased 21.5 percent.
- Power connections in service for residential were up 1.2 percent, commercial were up 0.1 percent and industrial were down 3.3 percent.
- Air passenger arrivals were down 9.7 percent, and departures were down 10.2 percent.
- Total cargo for the Port of Brownsville decreased 16.6 percent.
- Inbound cargo for the Port of Corpus Christi went down 11.1 percent, and outbound cargo went down 15.8 percent.

December 2009 End-of-Year (In Billions of U.S.\$)









Rail Cars into Mexico All Cited Cities Dec. 2008 vs. Dec. 2009: Up **12.0%** (In Thousands)



# Revenues Collected by U.S. Customs District of Laredo (in $\mbox{U.S.\$})$



Customs Revenues for the District of Laredo Dec. 2008 vs. Dec. 2009: **N/A** (In Millions of U.S.\$)





Bridge Revenues All Cited Cities Dec. 2008 vs. Dec. 2009: Down **5.0%** (In Millions of U.S.\$)





(Value of Permits In Millions of U.S.\$): Down 29.5%










